Coronavirus Guidance

Government advice regarding Coronavirus has been updated and many restrictions have been removed.

If your child has one of the three <u>main recognised symptoms of Coronavirus</u>, you should keep them at home and take a lateral flow test and follow current Government advice on further testing and additional precautionary measures. If your child tests positive for Coronavirus with a lateral flow or PCR test, you must keep them at home. If subsequent lateral flow tests taken on day 5 and day 6 are both negative, your child may return to school.


