## Iron Age Workshop



This week Year 3 have been extremely lucky to have a visit from Matt Russell (an Iron Age expert). The pupils took part in a full day workshop, where they got to examine historical artefact, make their own flour using a kern stone and discover what life would have been like in this period. They decorated their own shields and spear tips ready for warrior training. During warrior training they undertook a range of challenging tasks from learning how to throw a javelin and aiming at a target. As a result, we now have a fully trained group of Iron Age Warriors in Year 3.

#### Science week

The children all really enjoyed Science week, here are some of their highlights:

3OC: I loved learning about Mary Anning and I loved seeing all the fossils and learning about rocks and soils and doing experiments as well as doing light and doing the experiments about light too.


