#### The Big Draw Art Trip





On Tuesday 27th September, a group of Year 5 and 6 pupils visited Alton School and took part in The Big Draw Workshop. The task was to create a fish drawing to symbolise the children's feelings towards water conservation and cleanliness throughout the world. #### Free School Meals and Connect4Communities

If your employment or living circumstances change, additional support may be available to you from the school and in the locality.

Free School Meals are offered to children where parents are in receipt of certain benefits. You can check your eligibility by visiting the <u>Hampshire County Council Free School Meals webpage</u> and, if eligible, you can apply online for your child to receive free school meals.

If you need help to feed your family, we encourage you to contact or visit a local Community Pantry where you can access food at significantly reduced cost. You can read more about the Community Pantry scheme and find your nearest Pantry via the Connect4Communities website.

#### **Online Safety for Parents**

Virgin Media have shared with us a useful resource for parents with children who are just starting to make use of the world wide web. The site includes resources on many related areas, such as cyberbullying, identity theft and inappropriate content. This is coupled with four brief quizzes to test your own understanding of cyberbullying, parental controls, social media and inappropriate content. It was lovely to welcome back both former members and new joiners to the School Choir this September. Rehearsals have got off to a great start and the choir is sounding wonderful! **We have some extra spaces for children who would still like to join in years 4-6**. Everyone is welcome but we would particularly like to encourage **more boys who enjoy singing to give Choir a try!** The choir is friendly and fun and we explore a wide range of song repertoire; one of our current songs is called 'Roller Ghoster' which combines the excitement of a Roller Coaster Ride with the scariness of a Ghost Train – with actions to match!

The choir is open to pupils in **Years 4, 5 & 6** and rehearses **every Tuesday after school until 4.15pm** and performs regularly to pupils and parents at school concerts etc. Each year a number of our choir members take part in a concert of massed school choirs and orchestras, run by Basingstoke Primary Schools Music at the **Anvil**. Last year we performed 'Ocean Commotion' which was a great success and enjoyed hugely by both the children and the audience. This is a fantastic opportunity for the children and a highlight in the choir's calendar!

#### **Playground Safety**

The school playground is a busy area at the end of the school day when you collect your children.

For the safety of all playground users, please ensure that bikes and scooters are pushed and not ridden. Children are not permitted to use the trim trail or other play equipment – this is only for use by pupils under staff supervision during the school day only, as explained on our notices adjacent to the equipment. To prevent injury from falls, please do not allow children to climb trees.

#### Drinking water during the school day

All children have access to drinking water throughout the school day and we know that keeping hydrated is good for physical health and also improves focus and concentration during the school day.

Children can refill their drinking bottle during the school day, either from a drinking water supply in the classroom, or from one of several chilled water dispensers located around school.

Please make sure your child arrives at school each day with a re-usable, plastic or metal drinking bottle that they can easily refill when necessary.




