# Week ending Friday 12 January 2024 School Landscape

We recently invited all children to bring with them to school a pair of wellington boots for use during the school day. If you haven't already done so, please consider sending a pair that may be kept at school with your child so that they can access areas of our school grounds that are not accessible to them while wearing only school shoes – such as the field, which during the winter months if often too wet for shoes. If there happens to be any snowfall this winter then children will also be able to wear their boots when outside. We have provided storage for wellington boots outside all classrooms so that boots can be stored safely while airing / drying at the same time.



Until recently, an area of woodland within the school car park has been overgrown and offered no educations benefit to children. We have established a path into the wooded area and a clearing for children to visit and experience the outdoors. With their teacher or other school staff, they can use the space as a quiet area, spend time outside in a natural environment and explore the different sights, sounds, smells and textures within. As the weather improves, children may spend time in this natural environment working together in small groups and reading. They may also try identifying some of the plants they find, or build a den from the available materials.

## **Children's Commissioner - The Big Ambition Survey**


