Dear Parents and Carers,

This term is flying by with only two weeks left until the children enjoy a well-earned Easter break before returning to embark upon the final term of the school year!

Apart from class trips, workshops, and learning events a lot has been happening to enrich the curriculum, and this does not cover everything! We all enjoyed dressing up for World Book Day which ended nicely this year with a range of creative book related activities for the children in the hall. Thank you, Mr McLaren, for pulling this together. Miss Carne and Miss Stewart took Year 6 Prefects on a trip to London via the train for a tour of Parliament to explore the history of the building and be at the seat of democracy; they also enjoyed a question-and-answer session with the Rt. Hon. Ranil Jayawardena, M.P. Miss Orchard organised a fantastic Science Week and the science fair which the children have been buzzing about; thank you to parents and carers who presented at the fair and inspired the children to think about their future careers in science and finance. Miss Orchard and Miss Foxwell choreographed the dance routine for our children to perform at the Gremlin Dance Challenge in Aldershot, which they did so brilliantly, it is quite an experience to perform in a theatre before an audience, but they did with confidence, and we are hugely proud of them.

Yesterday our non-staff governors (4 of whom are parents and 1 previously a parent of a child at our school, and 3 who are not parents nor have a connection with the school) spent the day with staff governors (Senior Leaders) to undertake monitoring of actions and outcomes against our school strategic plan. They spent the day looking at the school in action, completed learning walks with senior leaders, spoke to children, observed lessons, looked at children's books, observed the start and end of the school day, observed intervention groups, had lunch with the children, explored policy, processes and systems for improving attendance and behaviour, looking at how we safeguard children and meet the needs of the equality act within our curriculum. It was a successful day, non-staff governors were impressed by the level of consistency, the children's behaviour and engagement, the quality of teaching and the commitment and care shown by all staff. Their reports will feed into our next governing body meeting and the school strategic plan. Thank you to all governors who were able to give their time to work with us, the treats for the staff were also gratefully received.

Science Week

Our science week kicked off with an electrifying visit from a rocket scientist (much to everyone's surprise, it turned out to be Miss Orchard's Dad!) who passionately shared insights into his role in the science industry. Following this, we hosted a STEM fair where professionals from diverse backgrounds engaged with all classes, shedding light on their exciting careers in the STEM field.

The children were captivated and inspired by the range of opportunities that science offers. We extend our gratitude to everyone involved in nurturing our children's passion for learning and paving the way for future rocket scientists, engineers, and many more.

In line with our theme of time, all classes embarked on fascinating journeys into the past to delve deeper into topics they've been exploring this year!

Year 3, currently delving into the mysteries of light, ventured back in time to assist the Croods in illuminating cave paintings in their neighbour's cave. They eagerly experimented with 'fire' torches to determine the optimal distance for clear visibility, immersing themselves in the ancient art.

Year 4, exploring the wonders of electricity, journeyed back to the origins of static electricity discovery. Through engaging experiments like the salt and pepper experiment, they uncovered the secrets of static electricity and even tested various materials to see which generated the most charge. Let's just say, a few balloons might have met their match in the process! :D

Year 5 took a thrilling trip through history to uncover the evolution of propulsion, connecting it to their exploration of space and forces. From Chinese fire arrows to crafting their own mini rockets, they investigated how air pressure affects flight distance, igniting their curiosity for the cosmos.

Meanwhile, Year 6, delving into the intricacies of the human body, embarked on a mission to unravel the mysteries of diagnosing bone fractures before the invention of X-rays!

Luckily, with the aid of simulated X-ray technology, they honed their diagnostic skills, setting the stage for future medical professionals.

Miss Orchard was astounded by the children's fervour for the subject and envisions a bright future filled with future scientists, innovators, and pioneers pushing the boundaries of knowledge and discovery.


Payments for Meals and Activities with Scopay
