Dear Parents and Carers,

We are two thirds of our way through the school year and this term has been packed with school events, fundraising, drama workshops, reading events, sporting activities and a lot of work behind the scenes to strengthen teaching learning and our curriculum. Hopefully through your attendance at learning events and learning consultations you may have seen evidence of the learning processes, creativity in thinking, breadth of delivery and depth in understanding across a holistic curriculum. As always the children have thrown themselves into their learning with enthusiasm and have achieved a lot over the past term, it is a privilege to see them grow socially, emotionally, academically and thrive.

At Hook Junior School we place great importance upon developing our practice and provision to enhance children's achievement. Every Wednesday after school we deliver a programme of professional development for all teachers and we do the same on a Friday during the school day for all LSAs/HLTAs; this enables us to share best practice, develop our practice and continually adapt our strategies to meet the needs of our children and changes in educational practice. Our programmes are derived from our School Strategic Plan and any recent updates to subjects as they arise.

This term staff have received and supported one another with moderating pupil work in writing and maths, assessment for learning, enquiry as a process for learning, phonics and spelling, curriculum design, memory and learning, mental health strategy, sketching in art, DT and computing skills development and guided reading. It is extensive and serves to improve teaching to improve learning and enjoyment of learning for the children. Every teacher is also a subject leader, this retains the integrity of a subject, its skills and body of knowledge, and allows us to assess children's understanding and learning whilst ensuring that every subject in our curriculum is important, is valued and provides our children with a breadth and balance across all aspects of learning.

Next term we face sports day, BPSM, strawberry tea, end of year reports, class transitions, Y6 SATS and production, in addition to year group learning events and the entire curriculum has to offer. Our new sports equipment from recent fundraising has arrived and the Trim Trail is
