A look at what's going on:


- Morning Assembly to launch our day

Pupils Give Birds Special 'Tweetment' For National Nestbox Week

As part of National Nestbox Week (14th to 21st February), David Wilson Homes teamed up with Hook Junior School to provide its pupils with a special bird-themed activity.

The national campaign encouraged UK residents to help create more homes for native birds and the leading developer sent a number of activity booklets for the pupils to match different species of birds to a variety of habitats.



Created by David Wilson Homes, the work booklets feature swifts, starlings, blue tits, robins, house martins, house sparrows and tawny owls; all of which match a distinctive nestbox to encourage pupils to think about how different species require particular homes.

Hook Junior School also received a donation of two nestboxes from David Wilson Homes for the pupils to welcome birds to their shared environment and to learn more about their feathered friends.

Mr Hall, year 5 teacher, said: "The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning all about the different birds and their unique habitats.

"Sincere thanks to David Wilson Homes for providing the nestboxes which will hopefully attract more birds to our school grounds."

The activity for National Nestbox Week is part of the homebuilder's efforts to create homes for wildlife as well as people, strengthened by its ongoing partnership with the RSPB.
