Governor News

The school governors have three main accountabilities: setting strategic direction for the school, maintaining robust accountability of the Leadership team, and ensuring financial probity. There are a range of ways this is achieved, including fulfilling some statutory requirements on behalf of the school. Our full governor meeting this week was only a few weeks after the previous, and with one of those weeks being half term, the main topics were supporting the submission of financial value information to Hampshire, and the regular review of some key policies. Planning has started for our Governor in School day towards the end of this term. This is an important opportunity for us to connect with the staff, see the school in full operation and see some of the positive activities that are taking place.

We always have a discussion of current issues affecting the school, and you won't be surprised to hear the topic of Ukraine came up. Mrs Martin shared how the school was responding and supporting the small number of families with direct links to the area. More generally, to answer questions from pupils about the conflict in Ukraine, the school are making use of material and guidance from Department of Education and others. Many in the school community have asked how they can support Ukraine at this difficult time. There are many local and national organisations already collecting, with fundraising and financial donations being the main ask due to the difficulty of transporting goods. Local collection banks have stopped taking clothing, however the HSCA have told us that for this week's Bag2School collection, they will give a proportion of the money raised to the Red Cross Ukraine Crisis Appeal.


