### **The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Week**

What a fantastic week we have had celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Thank you to everyone who gave a donation to our cake sale and non-uniform day. Our chosen 'Jubilee Charity' was Diabetes UK and we are delighted to have raised a fantastic total of £533.

### **Jubilee Week by Giles and Honor 6DK**

In Year Six throughout the week we have been celebrating the Queen's 70<sup>th</sup> Jubilee with a number of fun, learning activities and events. On Monday, we started off by singing the national anthem as a class. Our first main lesson was English, where we were writing to the Queen from the perspective of our chosen fairy tale character and persuading her to help out with our character's problem. The second lesson was researching about who the Queen is. After researching, we started to put the information into a poster or leaflet which has been continued throughout the rest of the week. In the afternoon, we made a net box to hold our scones that we made on Thursday. Some examples of box shapes include: cubes, cuboids, a trapezium and some pyramids.

On Thursday we sung the national anthem again and then did more English. For early morning work, we coloured and decorated some shields that were used in our posters. In the afternoon, we made a portrait of the queen as a class project that included skills like cutting, sticking, measuring, colouring and painting.

Other learning activities we enjoyed in the week was completing a word search to inform us about the Queen's life, followed by continuing to learn the iconic National Anthem. We also had lessons on 'Who is the Queen?' and 'What is the role of the Queen/Monarch?' For these sessions, we were given iPads where we could do our own research and then present it in the form of a poster/fact file.

At breaktime on Thursday, there was a cake sale in honour of her majesty, and all profits of this charitable event went to a diabetes charity, of which the Queen is patron. We then spent the whole

of the second session on Thursday making scones, (which were thoroughly enjoyed) ready to decorate later.

Throughout the week, our class created a portrait of the Queen in the 1960s. Everyone contributed and 6DK were very proud of the end result.

Robert Mays School have written to advise us that their consultations to change the length of the school day have concluded:

*Dear Primary/Junior Schools linked to Robert May's School,*

*You may remember that we wrote to you in January 2022 to begin a consultation to change the length of the school day at Robert May's School. You kindly agreed to share this consultation with your families - many of which have children coming to the school in September or will do in the future.*

*We are now in the very final stages of negotiations with Hampshire Transport and, at the time of writing, have an agreement that the school day at Robert May's School will be extended as planned. Our day will begin at 8.25am. Main school lessons will finish at 2.50pm for Key Stage 3 and 2.55pm for Key Stage 4. Buses will depart from school between 3.00pm and 3.30pm. Extra-curricular clubs and activities will run from 3.00pm – 4.00pm.*

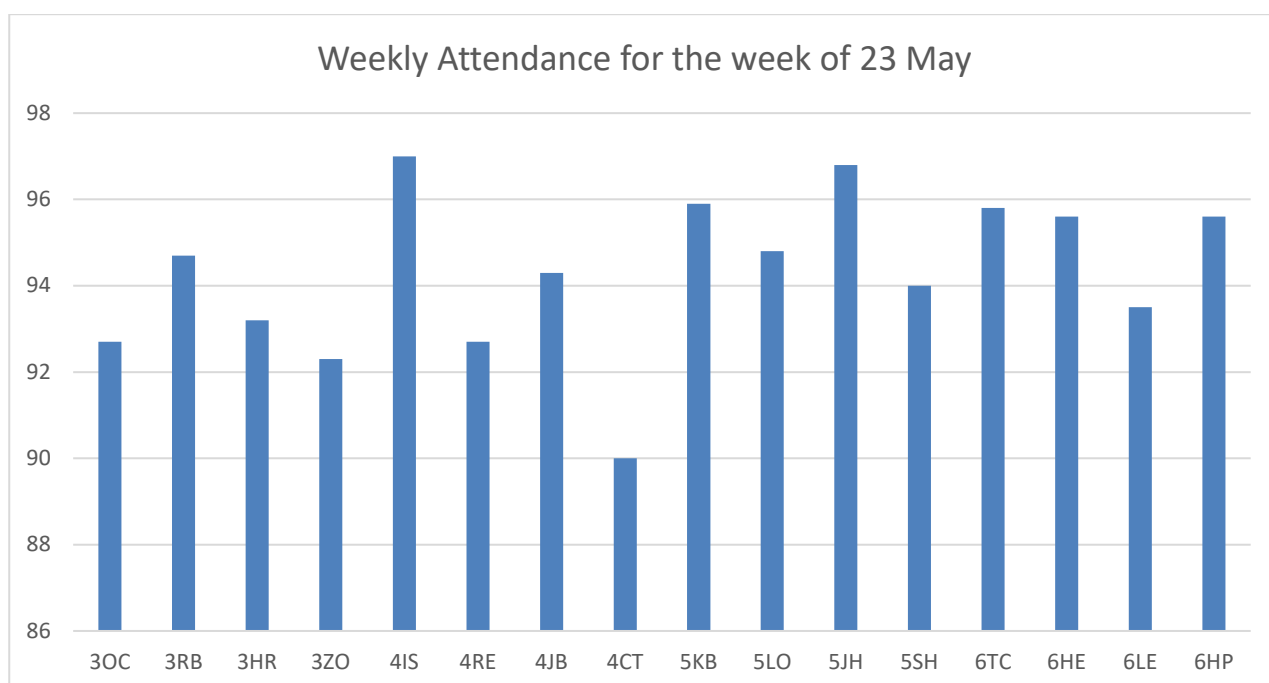
