Year 6 Girls Badminton



Thank you HSCA for an amazing firework show



Hampshire Illustrated Book Award 2022







The Year 5 children are currently taking part in the Hampshire Information Book Award, where they get to read and analyse shortlisted books chosen by The School Library Service.

The books were launched in a special assembly for the children on Tuesday where they got to see the books for the first time.

The aims of the award are to develop pupils' critical abilities of non-chronological texts using their discussion skills, whilst also helping them to develop the ability to evaluate information sources. It's a wonderful opportunity to watch the children grow in confidence using information texts and celebrate the value of information books in an electronic age.

In a couple of weeks, the children will be asked to vote on their favourite book – the results will be given to the School Library Service. The winning author is presented an award by Hampshire School Library Service. The results will be announced to the children at the start of December.


